1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Chairman; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Martin Triche.
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Patrick Lawless suggested that the committee enter into executive session to discuss the Weatherization employee matter.
3. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee enter into executive session to discuss personnel matters." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee resume regular session." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Chairman Patrick Lawless recognized Mr. Ricky Holmes, Weatherization Part-time temporary contractor, who stated that he was informed that he would be laid off due to lack of funding but when he received his separation notice it stated that he was dismissed for inappropriate behavior, poor performance, etc. He pointed out instances that he felt the Director showed inappropriate behavior as well as poor performance. He also stated that he tried to contact the Federal Programs Committee Chairman but didn't receive a response until the matter was placed on the agenda. He also stated that because a response was not received he met with President Martin Triche.
In response, Chairman Patrick Lawless stated that he spoke with Mr. Holmes several times and as Federal Programs Chairman it's his responsibility to oversee that department. He added that he received several complaints from constituents referencing Mr. Holmes work and behavior. He also informed him that he will support what is documented on paper because he was not present to witness any of the complaints.
Committee member Booster Breaux added that he also received several complaints referencing Mr. Holmes performance but he informed the Federal Programs Chairman as well as the Special Programs Director. He also informed Mr. Lawless that those complaints, if accurate, are unacceptable from any employee and termination should be sought.
Chairman Patrick Lawless recognized the Special Programs Director, who stated that within the last couple of months complaints were received against Mr. Holmes as well as he not showing up for work and no notification. In response, she stated that prior to June 18, 2011 she and the Weatherization Administrator documented everything.
In response, Mrs. Linda Richard stated that she was contacted by Mr. Holmes stating that the client was not home and that he would return on Saturday. She then stated that when asked if he returned on Saturday, Mr. Holmes informed her that he did not go. She also stated that she documented each time she received a complaint and at those times tried to contact Mr. Holmes referencing the complaint.
Chairman Patrick Lawless recognized Mr. Grady Rushing, who stated that he was the Weatherization carpenter and had not been working due to the lack of funding and the end of the program. He stated that he didn't have any complaints with Mr. Holmes doing his job but stated that they had several complaints made on the both of them. He stated that there are clients that just can't be pleased.
Committee member Martin Triche stated that the matter should have been discussed with the entire Jury before actions of cause were taken. He reiterated that the information that was presented to the Jury only indicated that the Weatherization funds were expended. Therefore, if other matters were occurring it should have been addressed before the Jury and a decision rendered thereafter. He stated that procedure is that all supervisors should report to the Police Jury before dismissing an employee. He then requested that the matter be discussed further to determine what should be done.
Police Juror Henry Dupre stated that this matter occurred two (2) months ago and should have been brought before the Police Jury for discussion. He stated that he would guarantee that after presenting the information that is documented, it would have been enough to terminate Mr. Holmes because that type of behavior would not have been acceptable.
Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to go into executive session to further discuss the matter.
6. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee enter into executive session to discuss personnel matters." The motion was unanimously adopted.

7. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee resume regular session." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve an amendment to the separation notice stating that Mr. Ricky Homes was laid off due to lack of funds or budgetary constraints as approved by the Police Jury." The motion was unanimously adopted.
9. Committee member Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Federal Programs Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

2. Chairman Jeff Naquin stated that the renewal of the Solid Waste contract was discussed at the previous meeting but several questions arose regarding the language in the contract.
He then recognized committee member Irving Comeaux who stated that he had some concerns with the Bulky Waste section of the contract but after his discussion with Mr. Warren Guidry, his concerns were addressed and explained and he has no further problems.
Mr. Warren Guidry stated that he appreciates the opportunity to come back and serve Assumption Parish as done in the past. He stated that as manager he really enjoyed working with each of the Jurors. He also stated Trevor Ash would be the district manager servicing Assumption Parish.
Committee member Martin Triche gave a brief summary of the negotiated terms which included no increase in the rate but the Consumer Price Index will increase on an annual bases beginning in July 2012. He stated that the new contract will include a 2nd boom truck to service the Parish to pick up trash and a one (1) free roll off dumpster to pick up derelict structures demolition with a \$200 fee for any dumpster thereafter. He further stated that the contract is for another 5 year term, July 1, 2011 – June 31, 2016 and recommends approval and acceptance.
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the committee approve the renewal of the Solid Waste Contract for the period of July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2016." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Solid Waste Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized representatives from FEMA, who in response stated that the Pump Redundancy Project is currently with FEMA and BCA, it is in top priority and everything is moving smoothly. It was further explained that once a project gets to FEMA there are separate reviews and then it goes to BCA. Committee member Myron Matherne stated that he's not understanding how other grants that the Parish are applying for are being approved and this grant has been out there for a while and not moving. Committee member Booster Breaux then explained that three (3) areas of the parish could be destroyed by flood waters, storms, etc. He stated that pumps have been requested for some time and the same thing has been stated each time a presentation is done. He further reiterated that this project needs to move forward or the Jury needs to be informed that the project will not be funded and other measures can be taken. He then asked what could be done by the Parish to get this project moving forward. In response, the FEMA Representative stated that the HMGP is a very slow program with very specific guidelines. She stated that the Parish has been working very well with getting the information that has been requested.
3. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux informed Mr. Matherne and Mr. Breaux that after Hurricane Andrew, the process for pumps in the Ward 3 area took a very long time as well but it was worth the wait. Following a brief discussion regarding the submission of all request by FEMA, the Representative stated that the quick action by the Parish did speed the process up and moved the project to a priority. She stated that it may 2-4 weeks before they hear from BCA to state if the project is feasible but since the project is in excess of \$1 million, it has to be sent to Washington, DC.
The OEP Director then informed the committee that this process has 2 phases and proceeded to explain each phase and stated that it would happen as quickly as it sounds once BCA has granted approval. He then stated that the pumps may not be received before this hurricane season is over.
Police Juror Booster Breaux requested that the Representative keep the OEP Director informed of the outcome when the 2-4 week process is over.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who requested authorization to advertise the preliminary plans and call for a public hearing for the Start Corporation Subdivision.
6. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve to advertise the preliminary plans and call for a public hearing for the Start Corporation Subdivision." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Martin Triche offered motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve a variance of 8 ft. from back property line at 402 Owens St." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury meeting room, located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4, Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Patrick Johnson offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of June 8, 2011." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the 'List of Bills' submitted through June 17, 2011." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Federal Programs Committee Chairman Patrick Lawless, who stated that the committee met and recommended that the Weatherization Employees separation notice be revised to state that there was a reduction in force due to budget constraints.
7. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Federal Programs Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
8. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; \$1,400 for Hwy 308-Ida Lou St. Catchasin Project, \$7,300 for Grisaffe Lane Culvert Installation Project subject to the Parish Engineer submitting a memo stating that the need of the project, \$400 for Himalaya Canal Tree Removal Project, \$1,650 for Hwy 401 Ditching Project subject to the State not performing the work within 30 days, and \$15,000 for phase 1 of Ewell St. Culvert Installation Project based upon the Parish Engineer's recommendation.
9. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as present." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
10. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Patrick Johnson, who stated that he would like to have snagging and removal of trees and branches from the south side of the Himalaya Canal due to the impassable state and drainage. This project will affect the residents of the front side of Hwy 1011 and 1012. In response, he stated that he received a bid from Robert Himel for \$4,800 and would like the project to be approved.
Following a brief discussion, the committee requested that the Parish Engineer draft the scope of the project and the Parish Manager get the appropriate right of ways.
11. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the committee approve \$4,800 for Himalaya Canal Snagging & Tree Removal Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
12. President Martin Triche recognized Solid Waste Committee Chairman Jeff Naquin, who stated that the committee met and recommended the renewal of the Solid Waste Contract with Waste Management. He stated that the concerns with the language were addressed and clarified and the changes approved were the addition of a 2nd boom truck that will assist with the bulky waste, the price index will increase and the contract price remains the same. He then recommended approval of the solid waste contract for the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2016 and authorize the President to sign.
13. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Solid Waste Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
14. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following; approved to advertise the preliminary plans and call for a public hearing for the Start Corporation Subdivision, approved a variance of 8 ft. from back

property line at 402 Owens St., approved a variance for front set back requirements at 242 Bayou Tranquille Rd. and received an update regarding the Hazardous Mitigation Pump Redundancy Project and within 2-4 weeks the OEP Director will have more information.

15. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
16. President Martin Triche recognized Mr. Henry Schwartz, Surveyor, who stated that he met with Mr. Dupre and updated him on the ongoing survey. He stated that he discovered that there is a piece of property that is owned by another individual that separates the two (2) tracts of property that the Jury was interested in purchasing. He stated that it's about ½ acre of property and the owner is interested in working something out with the Police Jury. He further stated that the Police Jury should decide how to proceed with the purchase of the additional piece of property.
In response, he stated that he plotted out the entire piece of property and presented the plat to the Jury. A brief discussion was then held regarding the Jury contacting the additional property owner to see if they have an interest in selling.
Following the discussion, President Martin Triche suggested that the Jury thank Mr. Schwartz for providing the information and authorize Police Juror Henry Dupre and staff to contact the owner and negotiate an acquisition and report back to the Jury.
17. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and authorize Police Juror Henry Dupre and staff to negotiate with the additional owner of property, in conjunction with the Belle Rose Library, to purchase the additional piece of property and report back to the Jury." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
18. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopt the amendment to the personnel manual related to emergencies." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
19. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve renewal of the Claims Administration Service Agreement with LoCA for a 2 yr. period." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
20. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Calvin James, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for Morales Properties, Provisions Private Sitting Services, LLC, Sew Blessed Embroidery." The motion was unanimously adopted.
21. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and adopt ordinance 11-09 to levy grass cutting charges." The motion was unanimously adopted. (ordinance attached)
22. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the 1st phase of the derelict structure phase for the structure located at Lot 4 on Sugar St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
23. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Booster Breaux, who stated that he previously requested that the Police Jury supply the constables with radios. He stated with so much going on in all communities, he believes the constables needs protection or a means of communication with the law enforcement agencies when they are doing their job. He also stated that he spoke with the OEP Director to make sure portable radios would be sufficient communication devices at a cost of \$1,800 each.
24. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve \$5,400 to purchase radios for the Parish Constables." The motion was unanimously adopted.
25. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a liquor license for St. Philomena Catholic Church." The motion was unanimously adopted.
26. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adding the following matters to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.
27. President Martin Triche requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding a supplemental agreement for the Safe Route to School Project. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments.
28. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury authorize and approve the supplemental agreement to pay the additional Engineering fees that will be reimbursed by the State." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)

29. President Martin Triche requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding a Can Shake for Pierre Part Baseball Team and Father Van Baast Jr. Daughters #23. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments.
30. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a Can Shake permit for Father Van Baast Jr. Daughters Ct. #23 and Pierre Part Baseball Team based on the team having a non-profit tax ID #." The motion was unanimously adopted.
31. In response to an update regarding the DMV Panic Alarm, the Secretary-Treasurer informed the Jury that she would be meeting with a representative of Safeguard Alarms System to walk through the building and submit a quote to install the alarm.
32. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Myron Matherne, who explained to the Jury that parishioners used to get together and have a firework display on Lake Verret for the Fourth of July but due to the expense, it has been eliminated for the last few years. Therefore, he requested that the Jury consider contributing funds from the recreation funds to make this event happen again in the Parish if it's a legitimate expense.
A brief discussion was then held regarding the accessibility to the entire parish and the legality of the donation from the recreation fund. Following the discussion, the Jury agreed to approve \$3,000 based on the ADA's opinion.
33. President Martin Triche requested comments, questions, or concerns regarding a \$3,000 contribution towards the Fireworks display on Lake Verret. Following three (3) calls, there were no comments.
34. Police Juror Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve \$3,000 from General Fund to assist with the Fireworks Display on Lake Verret subject to the ADA's legal opinion of the donation." The motion was unanimously adopted.
35. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

ORDINANCE 11-09

Upon a motion presented by Mr. Henry Dupre , seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson . the following Ordinance was presented for adoption:

An Ordinance amending Ordinance 11-07 to authorize the levy of charges for grass cutting as an assessment to be added to the annual Ad Valorem tax bill of the property involved and/or authorizing the placement of a lien on the property involved for non-payment of grass cutting charges in accordance with Assumption Parish Ordinance No. 89-04 as amended.

Be It Ordained by the Assumption Parish Police Jury, convened in Regular Session on this 22th day of June 2011, that:

Section 1. The following properties, identified by assessment numbers, located within the Parish of Assumption, be levied with the stated charges due plus thirty percent for collection fees for non-payment of grass cutting, and said charges shall become an assessment and form part of the ad valorem taxes due on said property by the owner and when collected shall be credited to the general fund of the parish.

Section 2. The Secretary-Treasurer of the Assumption Parish Police Jury is also hereby authorized and directed to file a special assessment against the subject property for the above charges if collection is not made as a result of action authorized in Section 1 above within 60 days. A certified copy of said special assessment shall be filed with the Clerk of Court of Assumption Parish, who shall forthwith record same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish. Such assessment when so filed and recorded shall operate as a lien and privilege against the property herein assessed, which lien and privilege shall rank from the date of filing of the assessment in the Mortgage Records of said Parish and shall prime all other claims, mortgages and liens, except taxes and prior recorded special assessment liens.

Section 3. If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this ordinance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption hereby expressly declaring that it would have passed the remaining portions of this Ordinance with the invalid portions omitted.

Section 4. Other ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Section 6. This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Police Jury was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, then vote thereon being as follows:
