Drainage Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Henry Dupre, Chairman; Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Calvin James.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Jeff Naquin.
2. Chairman Henry Dupre recognized ADA Lana Chaney, who stated that the Revised Statute 4884 adopted August 2010 stating that the parish can adopt ordinances for the installation of culverts etc. She stated that all other parishes require that the private landowner, without a public purpose, be responsible for payment of the culvert and installation. She stated that this statute derived from the swimming pools and drainage districts. A brief discussion was then held regarding the Jury's concerns with culverts along public servitude. Committee member Martin Triche requested that the ADA render an opinion regarding under what circumstance the Parish could install a culvert in a parish ditch without requiring compensation from the property owner. In response, ADA Lana Chaney stated that the statute also reference that even if the public purpose benefits the private landowner, the Parish can still require payment. She again stated that the installation of a culvert in a parish ditch without a public benefit would require that the private landowner pays 100% of the installation cost. Following a brief discussion of the many reasons (erosion, high shoulder, outfall, etc.) a culvert would be needed other than a drainage problem, the committee agreed that each situation would be handled separately. Committee member Martin Triche suggested that the committee accept the recommendation of the ADA to utilize parish funds for installation of culverts in parish ditches when the public purpose is identified and derives a benefit, if not, the private owner would have to bear the cost (culvert, materials).
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the recommendation of the ADA to utilize parish funds for the installation of culverts in parish ditches when the public purpose is identified and the parish derives a benefit otherwise, the private owner would have to bear the cost." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$1,550 for Felicia St. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve tabling 114 Ewell St. Culvert Installation Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the committee approve \$820 for Verret St. Culvert Replacement Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Myron Matherne offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Drainage Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Solid Waste Committee Meeting

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Jeff Naquin, Chairman; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Mr. Myron Matherne, Mr. Martin Triche.  
Committee members recorded as absent were: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Mr. Calvin James.  
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Booster Breaux.
2. Chairman Jeff Naquin stated that the renewal is for another 5 year term, July 1, 2011 – June 31, 2016. He then stated that the current price will remain the same but the Consumer Price Index will increase. Committee member Irving Comeaux had some concerns with the Bulky Waste section of the contract. He added that the parish experienced trouble with the present contractor picking up bulky waste without notification.
3. Committee member Calvin James entered the meeting at this time.
4. A brief discussion was then held regarding the present contract allowing for 2 cubic yds. of bulky waste as well as allowing seven (7) days for pick up or the assessment of liquidated damages.  
In response, Mr. Comeaux stated that the Parish very seldom assessed liquidated damages and his concern is with the Contractor holding the Parish to what is written in the contract.  
In response, Chairman Jeff Naquin stated that the new contract will include a 2<sup>nd</sup> boom truck which may eliminate so of these problems.  
Committee member Irving Comeaux stated that the Parish should add what is wanted and expected and not allow the Contractor to tell the Parish what they want and will do.  
Committee member Martin Triche stated that the proposal is fair and suggested that the matter be tabled until the next meeting at which time the Contractor is invited to the meeting to present their contractual changes and address any concerns the Jury may have.  
A brief discussion was held regarding the many ways the contractor go above and beyond the present contract.
5. Police Juror Henry Dupre stated that Ascension Parish is considering adoption of an ordinance requiring residents with derelict structures or garbage to bring to a landfill. Therefore, illegal dumping in Ward 7 will probably become more of a problem. He further stated that he is trying to identify those persons that are doing this but no success.  
In response to the camera, the Parish Manager stated that the Village of Napoleonville used the camera and they got up to 50 pictures of tractors and a truck which you couldn't tell if they were taking out or putting in. He explained that there are people that scrap through the rubbish.
6. Committee member Martin Triche recommended that the committee agree to the terms but request that the contractor attends the next meeting to make a presentation and respond to the concerns before a final approval is given.  
Police Juror Henry Dupre requested that the Secretary-Treasurer send a copy of the present contract to all Jurors.
7. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, there are no further business to come before the Solid Waste Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

He further stated that during an emergency situation, the decision will be made on a case by case basis. Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Manager, who stated that the change orders included, beddings for culverts, put a step instead of a ramp, and a few clean up areas but the cost would not be affected.
3. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve change order #1, 2, & 3 for the Safe Routes to School Program (Napoleonville Sidewalks Project." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
5. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that Mr. Clarence Millet is requesting a variance with compliance to the trailer park ordinance. He stated that there is a trailer and an old structure that is used only for storage. However, he will be placing a new trailer behind of the old structure for him to reside. Following a brief discussion, the committee agreed to grant a variance subject to Mr. Millet signing an affidavit stating that the existing old structure can't be used for residential purpose.
6. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, the committee approve a variance at 1360 Highway 401 subject to Mr. Clarence Millet signing an affidavit stating that the old trailer will be used for residential storage purposes only." The motion was unanimously adopted.
7. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve a variance at 184 Bayou Tranquille Court relative to side set backs." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Mr. Stephen Vigory, Duplantis Design Group, who stated that they received six (6) bids for the Bayou L'Ourse Community Center Project. He stated that all bids came in at 6% of each other and the low bid of \$788,900 was submitted by BETCO Construction. He further stated that the bid was reviewed and found to be responsible therefore, recommends that the bid be accepted. The OEP Director recommended that the committee accept the low bidder and contract contingent upon the final approval of environmental from OCD.
9. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the low bid of \$788,900 submitted by BETCO Construction as provided and recommendation by Duplantis Design Group and contract contingent upon the approval of all permits by OCD, Disaster Recovery Division." 10. The OEP Director also stated that a budget amendment was done for additional funding. He proceeded to state that the Bayou L'Ourse Community Center had to be increased to \$960,000 and the amount of the Parish Health Unit had to be reduced to \$590,000 to make up the difference. He also informed that board that by the end of the week he should have the approval to go out for bid for the Assumption Community Center.
11. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Martin Triche, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering/Grants Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of May 25, 2011." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. President Martin Triche recognized Federal Programs Committee Chairman Patrick Lawless, who stated that the committee met and recommended hiring a summer worker for 15 hrs. per week through Work Connection.
6. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Federal Programs Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
7. 10. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Solid Waste Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
11. President Martin Triche stated that the Finance Committee met and recommended the following matters; approved to pay bills submitted through June 3, 2011, accepted Capital One as the Fiscal Agent for the period of July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2013, approved an additional \$1,500 for Registrar of Voters travel, and approved an additional 15 hrs. per week for the Registrar of Voters part-time worker from June 9, 2011 to November 22, 2011 at same rate of pay.
12. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Irving Comeaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Finance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
