Engineering/Grants Committee Meeting
Of the

5:30 O'clock p.m.

1. Committee members recorded as present were: Mr. Irving Comeaux, Chairman; Mr. Henry Dupre, Mr. Jeff Naquin, Mr. Patrick Lawless, Mr. Martin Triche.
Other Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Calvin James, Mr. Booster Breaux, Mr. Myron Matherne.
2. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the OEP Director, who stated that the landowner of 106 Live Oak St. is requesting a 2 ft. variance on the side set back requirements. He stated that a letter was submitted by the neighbors stating that they have no objections to the variance.
3. Committee member Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve a 2 ft. variance on the side set back requirement at 106 Live Oak St." The motion was unanimously adopted.
4. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized Police Juror Calvin James, who stated that he has concerns with the appearance and the aged mobile homes that are being placed in Assumption Parish mainly in Ward 6. He asked that the Jury consider requesting an Attorney General's opinion as to what the Parish can do to govern these structures.
Chairman Irving Comeaux stated that a trailer was moved into Bayou L'Ourse and the mover had to charge extra due to the condition and when it was placed on the designated lot it began to fall apart. He then stated that the mobile home should not have been sold in that condition and that there should be some sort of an inspection done before hand.
In response, the OEP Director stated that Terrebonne and St. John Parishes have an inspection requirement and it is being discussed that there should be some consistency within the region. He then stated that there is an issue being discussed relative to FEMA trailers that just surfaced from the State Code Council. He also stated that these trailers are being sold but they do not comply with the HUD Standards, which means that they cannot be used as a permanent dwelling. He then stated that if individuals purchase these, they could only be used as a storage building or a camp. In response, he stated that FEMA has advised that they are informing the buyers of this factor, but if they are being sold to large companies the information may not be passed on.
Chairman Irving Comeaux stated that a new construction has so many requirements to meet and the neighbor can move a derelict trailer on the lot for less than minimum, set it up, and move in it. He then stated that the Parish could never improve a neighborhood if they constantly allow this to happen.
In response, the OEP Director stated that in order for the trailer to be placed there under inspection, it would have had to pass the wind zone regulation, proper anchoring, electrical code, plumbing requirements, air condition connection, etc. He stated that the trailers in question would not pass these regulations, but the Parish is not required to perform these inspections.
A brief discussion was held regarding the trailers that are moved into the Parish and the inspection that is required. Following the discussion, it was suggested that the OEP Director look into what's done by the neighboring parishes and see if there is something that can be added relative to the appearance of the trailer.
5. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the committee approve adding the following matters to the agenda." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized committee member Martin Triche, who stated that Eno Theriot Estate family owned subdivision was accepted as a privately owned subdivision in 1994. He stated that they are swapping land or lots within the family therefore, requesting authorization for a variance. He then stated that he has no objection subject to them paying the \$200 fees for the revised plat.
7. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the committee approve the revised plat of Eno Theriot Est. relative to exchange of property subject to the payment of the required \$200 fee." The motion was unanimously adopted.
8. Chairman Irving Comeaux recognized the Parish Engineer, who stated that the Sheriff's Office is currently experiencing some leaks from the roof. He stated that they contacted the manufacturer of the roof for the warranty but the contractor that supplied the roof didn't do diligence with the warranty. He stated that the contractor didn't follow proper procedure in construction of the roof therefore, he contacted the warranty company to inspect the roof and provide quotes to repair the damages and bring the roof under warranty as well as a general leak repairs. He stated that the quotes received were \$14,921 to correct what was done by the contractor and bring the roof under a 20 yr. warranty or \$24,915 to put a new covering over the entire roof and a 20 yr. warranty. He also stated that they also submitted a cost of \$17,000 for basic roof repair. He then recommends that the Jury approve and accept the \$14,921 to correct the damage by the contractor and bring the roof under a 20 yr. warranty. Committee member

Martin Triche suggested that procedures be taken to file suit against the contractor for all cost to repair the roof and legal fees incurred.

9. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the committee approve and accept the \$14,921 quote to correct the damages and bring the roof under a 20 yr. warranty and authorize the ADA to follow the appropriate procedures to recoup all cost from the contractor to repair the roof and legal fees incurred." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. Committee member Martin Triche offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Engineering Committee, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

Committee member recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson.
2. President Martin Triche stated that the purpose of the public hearing is to receive comments, questions and concerns regarding the development of a new subdivision, Circuit Grand Bayou. He then opened the meeting to receive comments and recognized Mr. Leroy Blanchard, PVFD, who requested more details on what is being proposed at that location.
In response, Mr. Kent Broussard, owner of Circuit Grand Bayou, stated that there will be 18 lots for garages/garden homes. He stated that it will be designed for drivers to store their cars and have a place to reside for the weekend.
Mr. Paul Gilmore then stated that the PVFD is concerned about the fire protection for that area. He stated that there is inadequate water supply throughout the Brule area and spoke about doing water connection from LA 1000 into the 996 Loop. He then stated that property insurance will look at large buildings there and anything requiring over the 500 gallons a minute water supply the PVFD will be docked and the entire district rating will suffer. He then suggested that the Jury again request that the Water Board reconsider placing more priority on the LA Hwy 1000 to 996 Loop.
A brief discussion was held regarding what could be done to help the water supply to the area in question.
3. Following three (3) calls, there were no additional comments therefore, Mr. Triche requested that the public hearing be closed.
4. Committee member Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

1. The Regular Meeting of the Assumption Parish Police Jury was called to order by Police Jury President Martin Triche in the Assumption Parish Police Jury meeting room, located at 4813 Highway 1, Napoleonville, Louisiana.
2. Police Jurors recorded as present were: Mr. Patrick Lawless, Ward 1; Mr. Jeff Naquin, Ward 2; Mr. Irving Comeaux, Ward 3; Mr. Martin Triche, Ward 5; Mr. Calvin James, Ward 6; Mr. Henry Dupre, Ward 7; Mr. Booster Breaux, Ward 8; Mr. Myron Matherne, Ward 9.
Police Juror recorded as absent was: Mr. Patrick Johnson, Ward 4.
3. President Martin Triche led the Prayer and Police Juror Calvin James led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.
4. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the minutes of May 26, 2010." The motion was unanimously adopted.
5. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve payment of bills submitted through June 4, 2010." The motion was unanimously adopted.
6. President Martin Triche recognized Insurance Committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended that the present insurance agents be authorized to seek the best proposals and carbon copy the Jury with each proposal that is received and approve entering into a contract with LoCA for claims administration commencing August 1, 2010 and authorize the President to sign.
7. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Insurance Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
8. President Martin Triche recognized Drainage committee Chairman Henry Dupre, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; \$500 for Valance Road Culvert Replacement Project, \$500 for Valance Road Catchbasin Project, \$200 for 2626 Hwy 1010 Culvert Replacement Project, \$1,100 for 523 Hwy 1000 Culvert Replacement Project, \$1,650 for Culvert Installation behind the Pierre Part School Project, \$3,200 for Crawfish St. Culvert Installation Project, \$750 for James St. Culvert Replacement Project, and allocate \$3,000 to the Town of Napoleonville for the rental of a vacuum truck.
9. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Myron Matherne, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Drainage Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted.
10. President Martin Triche recognized Engineering/Grants Committee Chairman Irving Comeaux, who stated that the committee met and recommended the following matters; granted a 2 ft. variance on the side set back requirement at 106 Live Oak St., authorized the OEP Director to look into inspections of aged mobile homes, accepted the revised plat for the Eno Theriot Subdivision relative to the exchange of property and subject to payment of the required \$200 fee, approved to file suit on the contractor of the Sheriff's Office Roofing Project and approve \$14,921 to correct the roofing problems.
11. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Henry Dupre, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the Engineering/Grants Committee report as presented." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolutions attached)
12. President Martin Triche stated that a public hearing was held to receive comments, questions and concerns regarding the development of a new subdivision, Circuit Grand Bayou. He stated that the Jury heard from the owner of the subdivision explaining what he is proposing at that location. He also stated that Mr. Leroy Blanchard and Paul Gilmore of the Paincourtville Fire Department expressed their concerns relative to the water flow in that area and how it will affect their fire rating.
13. Police Juror Patrick Johnson entered the meeting at this time.
14. President Martin Triche opened the meeting to the public to receive public comments, questions or concerns. Following three (3) calls there were no comments.

15. President Martin Triche requested that another request be made to the OEC Enforcement Division of DEQ asking that a representative attend the next meeting to discuss the Compliance Order and status of Ridgeway Mobile Home Park.
16. President Martin Triche recognized the Secretary-Treasurer, who stated that bid proposals for the official journal were received from The Bayou Journal and The Assumption Pioneer. She stated that the Bayou Journal submitted a proposal of \$2.70 per column inch equivalent to \$4.70 per legal square for 1st and subsequent publications and the Assumption Pioneer submitted a proposal of \$2.25 per legal square for the 1st and any subsequent publication. Therefore, she suggested that the low bid of \$2.25 per legal square submitted by The Assumption Pioneer Jury be accepted.
17. Police Juror Jeff Naquin offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Lawless, "THAT, the Police Jury approve and accept the Assumption Pioneer as the Official Journal for July 1, 2010 – June 30, 2010." The motion was unanimously adopted. (resolution attached)
18. President Martin Triche stated that Ginger Rushing represented Assumption Parish on the Atchafalaya Trace Commission but has submitted her resignation due to time restraints. He then stated that he would like to send her a letter of thanks for her time served. He further stated that if a Juror knows of anyone that would be interested in serving on this Board to submit their information at the next meeting.
19. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve the successful completion of probationary period for the Section 8 Administrator Janice Tregre." The motion was unanimously adopted.
20. Police Juror Henry Dupre offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Patrick Johnson, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adopting a proclamation recognizing many Assumption Parish families for their contribution to the Bayou Lafourche Region of Louisiana." The motion was unanimously adopted. (proclamation attached)
21. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve an occupational license for Painted Dreams, MVS Painting and Drywall, Sagona's Tractor Works LLC, and DC Batteries of Louisiana LLC." The motion was unanimously adopted.
22. Police Juror Booster Breaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, the Police Jury approve adopting Ordinance 10-04 to levy grass cutting charges." The motion was unanimously adopted.
23. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Henry Dupre, who stated that everyone is aware of the recent drowning that happened in the Klotzville area of the Parish. He stated that the Parish should consider addressing abandoned/derelict homes with open pools. He informed the Jury that a letter was sent to the owner regarding the clean-up of the burned structure as well as the hazard that the open pool posed in the neighborhood. Therefore, he requested that the Police Jury consider adopting an ordinance relative to this concern.
A brief discussion was then held regarding the hazards of an open/abandoned pool or an unattended hole in the ground (pond, pit, etc.).
Following the discussion, the Police Jury agreed to authorize the ADA to render an opinion on this matter.
24. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Calvin James, who stated that there are three (3) trailer homes in the Brule St. Vincent/Hwy 402 area, on the right hand side of the street that does not have cable connection. He then requested that a letter be sent to Charter Communications requesting the reason they are not connected and what needs to be done to get them connected.
25. Police Juror Calvin James offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve a letter to Charter Communications requesting the reason certain residents in Brule St. Vincent/Hwy 402 area, on the right hand side, are not receiving cable service and that they consider getting them connected." The motion was unanimously adopted.
26. President Martin Triche recognized Police Juror Irving Comeaux, who stated that a car ran into the fence at the Hwy 663 dam and the person had no insurance. He then asked if he can be held accountable to pay for those damages.
A brief discussion was held regarding the damages and what can be done.
In response, the ADA stated that this person was sited with a traffic violation therefore, if an estimate is received for the damages, it can be included in the violation and reimbursed to the drainage district.
27. Police Juror Irving Comeaux stated that the residents of Bayou L'Ourse are still requesting tower service in that area and still nothing is being done. He then stated that he has received responses from a few of the cellular companies politely stating that they would not be installing a tower in that area.

The OEP Director stated that he received a call from a company representing AT&T stating that they are currently looking for a site to construct a tower and requested setback requirements as set forth within the ordinance.

Mr. Comeaux then stated that the residents are requesting or demanding that they be excluded/released from their contracts, without penalty, due to the lack of or no service.

28. Police Juror Irving Comeaux offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Booster Breaux, "THAT, the Police Jury approve sending a letter to the different cellular companies requesting that they release Bayou L'Ourse residents from their contracts due to lack of or no signal/service." The motion was unanimously adopted.

29. Police Juror Patrick Lawless offered a motion, seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin, "THAT, there being no further business to come before the Assumption Parish Police Jury, the meeting be adjourned." The motion was unanimously adopted.

ORDINANCE 10-04

Upon motion presented by Mr. Booster Breaux , seconded by Mr. Jeff Naquin , the following Ordinance was presented for adoption:

An Ordinance amending Ordinance 09-21 to authorize the levy of charges for grass cutting as an assessment to be added to the annual Ad Valorem tax bill of the property involved and/or authorizing the placement of a lien on the property involved for non-payment of grass cutting charges in accordance with Assumption Parish Ordinance No. 89-04 as amended.

Be It Ordained by the Assumption Parish Police Jury, convened in Regular Session on this 9th day of June 2010, that:

Section 1. The following properties, identified by assessment numbers, located within the Parish of Assumption, be levied with the stated charges due plus thirty percent for collection fees for non-payment of grass cutting, and said charges shall become an assessment and form part of the ad valorem taxes due on said property by the owner and when collected shall be credited to the general fund of the parish.

The Secretary-Treasurer of the Assumption Parish Police Jury is also hereby authorized and directed to file a special assessment against the subject property for the above charges if collection is not made as a result of action authorized in Section 1 above within 60 days. A certified copy of said special assessment shall be filed with the Clerk of Court of Assumption Parish, who shall forthwith record same in the Mortgage Records of said Parish. Such assessment when so filed and recorded shall operate as a lien and privilege against the property herein assessed, which lien and privilege shall rank from the date of filing of the assessment in the Mortgage Records of said Parish and shall prime all other claims, mortgages and liens, except taxes and prior recorded special assessment liens.

Section 3. If any section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, paragraph, provision or portion of this ordinance, the Police Jury of the Parish of Assumption hereby expressly declaring that it would have passed the remaining portions of this Ordinance with the invalid portions omitted.

Section 4. Other ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately.

Section 6. This ordinance, having been submitted in writing, having been read and adopted by sections at a public meeting of said Police Jury was then submitted to an official vote as a whole, then vote thereon being as follows:
